#### **Returning children September 2023**

If your child is returning to nursery in September we will allocate the same sessions unless you let us know.

#### 30 hours nursery childcare for children aged 3 years.

If you and your partner earn the equivalent of 16 hours at the National Minimum wage you should qualify for 30 hours childcare in the term after your child turns 3 years. Please visit www.childcarechoices.gov.uk. If you qualify please speak to Mandy or Claire on Reception about your sessions for September. You need your code by <u>31st August</u> to qualify for <u>September</u>. Thank you.
