What do I need to bring with my child?

We play outside every single day. Please make sure your child arrives in a suitable coat for the weather. A drawstring bag will be provided for you to keep the following items in at nursery:

- A full set of spare clothes at all times. All items to be marked with your child's name.
- Warm hat in winter & a sun hat in summer. Named sun cream for children staying all day.
- If your child is not yet potty trained: make sure there are 2 nappies, suitable wipes and nappy bags in your child's bag each day. We do not supply these items.

Please send your child in clothes that are easy for them to fasten themselves, e.g. jogging bottoms and Velcro shoes rather than jeans and lace up shoes. No open toed sandals. Your child **WILL** get dirty! Please do not send your child in their best clothes.

Funded Entitlements and Additional Hours

All parents are entitled to 570 hours each year from the term after their child's third birthday. Or some children are entitled the term after they turn age two. This is available as 15 hours each week during term time at Ronald Tree Nursery School, as either a morning or an afternoon place, Monday to Friday. We have a dedicated room for our funded 2 year olds.

Where we have capacity, parents of 15 hours funded three and four year olds may buy additional hours beyond these session times. This includes:

- Breakfast club (8am to 8.30am breakfast included) currently £3.00 per day;
- Lunch club (11.30 to 12.30 please provide a packed lunch) currently £5.00 per day; or
- Afterschool club to 4pm currently £2.50 or to 4.30pm currently £5.00 per day.

Where parents meet the government criteria, and where we have capacity, children may attend for 1140 hours each year/30 hours each week during term time. We offer of flexible options for parents e.g.:

• 4 Days e.g. 8.00am to 3.30pm or 8.30 to 4.00pm

If parents would like their child to attend for more than 30 hours per week, the additional hours are charged at a flat rate (currently £5/hour).

Please note that if your child has attended another nursery or childminder and you have claimed your entitlement over the full year rather than in term time only, this will affect the number of funded hours you can claim at Ronald Tree Nursery School. Please let us know if this is the case.

You can check whether you are eligible for 2 year old or 30 hours funding by visiting **www.childcarechoices.gov.uk**. You can also use this website to register for tax free childcare payments, which we accept.

Please be on time when dropping off and collecting your child as children get upset if they see others arriving or leaving at different times.

You must let us know in advance if someone different is collecting your child. Please ring on 01536-514240 if this is a last minute decision.

Attendance

Nursery places are in great demand so please use your place well. To enable your child to get the most from what the nursery offers it is important to come regularly.

However if your child is unwell please do keep them at home until they are better.

All our policies relating to admissions, attendance and medical conditions can be found on the school website.

If your child has sickness or diarrhoea please keep them at home for 48 hours after the last bout, as this spreads very quickly with young children.

If you wish to take your child on holiday during term time you must let the nursery know by completing an absence form. Please note this may affect your entitlement to funding from the local authority and may result in a charge.

We teach the statutory areas of development as required in the EVES

We choose to use the non-statutory guidance in Development Matters to track progression and moderate expectation.

Planned learning experiences

While we follow much of the Planning in the moment approach, we recognise that our children need adult identified tasks too.
Things that we believe all children should have the opportunity to experience such as: sharing classic children's books and traditional tales, planting a seed and watching it grow, going to the shops and using money, cooking a snack or a meal – so we plan these in as part of our curriculum over the year.



Communication friendly settings

We recognise that many of our children join us with low levels of expressive and responsive language.

Therefore we have a particular focus on developing language skills using many of the techniques and resources shared in Communication Friendly Settings

Focus child observations

We have taken this idea from the Planning in the moment approach. Each child gets a turn to have a week in which the team observe them in detail and work with their family to identify strengths and areas of future focus.
