We ensure that all adults who work or volunteer in our school are subject to the appropriate security checks including Disclosure and Barring checks (DBS).

What is Safeguarding?

Visitors coming onto school premises, including the playground, have a duty of care towards the welfare and safety of the children and adults in the school. This is called safeguarding.

Safeguarding means:

- Protecting children from maltreatment
- Preventing the impairment of children's mental and physical health or development
- Ensuring that children grow up in circumstances consistent with the provision of safe and effective care, and
- Taking action to enable all children to have the best outcomes

Safeguarding is the action we take to promote the welfare of children in our care to protect them from harm. We take this responsibility very seriously.

Child Protection: This is the process of protecting children who may be suffering from, or at risk of, significant harm. This includes physical abuse, sexual abuse, neglect, and emotional harm.

Child protection promotes the rights and welfare of all our children. If a child tells you something, keep calm, listen, do not question, and never make promises. If you have concerns, or if the child discloses something to you, **Speak to one of our safeguarding leads immediately.**
